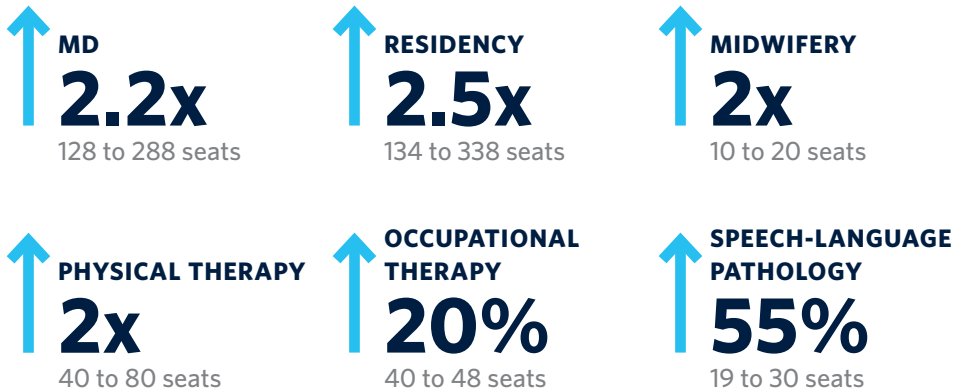

Increase in the number of MD graduates entering residency training since 2003.

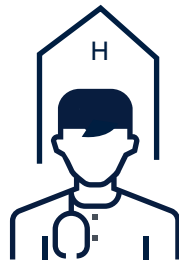


Meeting B.C.'s Health Care Needs
